About Oberlin College

The liberal arts college and world-class conservatory celebrates individuality and wants each student to feel a sense of belonging and flourish in a supportive environment with faculty mentors and peers.

College of Arts and Sciences

Oberlin offers over 40 majors in its <u>College of Arts and Sciences</u> and focuses on keeping class sizes small. The college believes in hands-on experiences to make connections between learning and doing through research projects, undergraduate teaching, study-aboard trips, world-class music opportunities and more.

Conservatory of Music

Campus Experience

The four-year residential college fosters a strong community of students through campus <u>housing and dining</u>. Students have various housing options, including residence halls, co-ops, college-owned houses and apartments, and identitybased communities and language houses.

Musically talented students may apply and audition to attend the <u>Oberlin Conservatory of</u> <u>Music</u> in undergraduate, master's and performance programs. Oberlin Conservatory of Music students gain access to internationally renowned faculty, visiting artists and exceptional facilities.

The Conservatory presents nearly 500 concerts annually that span five centuries of music. Students appreciate using one of the nation's top conservatory libraries and having access to nine concert halls, 150 practice rooms, over 240 Steinway pianos and more than 30 organs for both practicing and performing.

Course Selections

Kendal at Oberlin residents, with permission from an Oberlin College professor, can <u>audit liberal arts classes at no cost</u>. They may attend concerts, recitals and other musical events at the Conservatory of Music throughout the year, as well as on-campus activities and lectures.

"I've audited everything from Shakespeare to Constitutional Law and several art history courses," says Kendal resident Elizabeth H. "I really enjoy having my mind challenged and watching the bright and lively minds of the students at work."

Oberlin students and professors have worked together with Kendal at Oberlin on energy and environmental initiatives, as both organizations <u>value sustainability</u>. We also collaborate on musical performances featuring musically gifted residents and Oberlin Conservatory students.

Oberlin College has four libraries — Main, Art, Science and Conservatory. All are open to Kendal residents who have valid Oberlin Public Library Cards. Additionally, the college owns the century-old Apollo Theater, which hosts everything from blockbusters to foreign and independent movies. During warmer months, residents can even walk or bike to this attraction to catch a show.

Getting Started

The Kendal at Oberlin Residents Association (KORA) publishes a monthly newsletter, *The Kendalight*, which features numerous lifelong learning opportunities both on Kendal's campus and nearby Oberlin College and Conservatory. The issue is packed with classes, activities, outings and volunteer opportunities.

There's something for everyone, and if you're interested in starting something new, you can — and should! Kendal at Oberlin's <u>resident-led</u> <u>lifestyle</u> encourages engagement, purpose and ongoing involvement in lifelong and new interests. Dozens of resident committees plan most of the programming mentioned in the monthly newsletter.

Joining a committee is fun! You can meet new friends, learn something new and engage in meaningful activities.

"We learn from each other; it's really fun," says Kendal resident Mary V.N. "It's like creating anything — it's beautiful, gives me pleasure and helps me relax. And being on a committee, you make new friends."
